Issues are rectified immediately for betterment of teaching learning process. • Various activities and competitions on topic like Seminars, Poster presentations, Power Point presentations, Slogan writing on contemporary social, environmental issues, essay, dialogue writing competitions. Students are motivated and guided to participate in various University, state, National level activities. Industry / field visits are also arranged as per the requirement to acquaint students with experience of real life field work. This help inculcating social ethics and values in the students, making them responsible citizens. Teachers keep pace with evolving pedagogy, technological advancements in the teaching field.

4.4.2 Procedures and policies for maintenance of Infrastructure - Building and Campus infrastructure facility maintenance procedure- Being a state Government college, the maintenance of the building and campus is looked after by Public Works Department (PWD). The college office authorities coordinate with the PWD department. The college follows the procedure laid down by the state government for maintenance. Maintenance of Electrical, Electronic equipment and laboratories: The college has a permanent technical employee for the maintenance of electrical and electronic work of the departments. The same employee has been designated to look after the requirements of all the laboratories of the college including chemicals, equipment machinery etc. The various departments of the college submit a written application to the inward section to fulfil their need for facilities in their department. The application is directed to the technical employee, who looks into the matter to provide relevant service to the developments. All the committees work efficiently to maintain and upgrade the various facilities in college without delay.

Distinct Feature of the college State level elocution competition organized by Alumni students Government college of Arts and science has a rich tradition of participation and bagging prizes in various intercollegiate and state level elocution and debate competitions. Keeping this in view, alumni students decided to hold state level elocution competition since 2012. This is the eighth year of competition. Now this is one of the reputed competitions in Maharashtra state. Objectives: 1. To bring many students as possible from across the state under one roof and discuss the prevailing issues 2.To create good orators among students' 3.To create stage courage and confidence among students. Practice: The college along with alumni organizes competition generally in the month of January or February. Some of the alumni spends a separate time for this competition. They contribute for prizes of Rs.12000 and other expenses of the competition. College uses manpower through organizing committee. Alumni who are working in different areas decides the subjects of the competition. These subjects are generally based on social, political and economic issues. Competition is in Marathi language. There are two rounds of the competition. First is the round based on the given subjects. All participants talk on the given subjects. Second round is based on the spontaneous elocution of top ten selected students. Topics are given on the spot in the final round. Participant have to pick up the cheat of topic randomly from the bowl. Two minutes are given to the participant to think about the topic. Examiners of the competition are from Medical, Teaching, Journalism, legal and different areas. Prizes are as following First prize Rs.5000, Second prize Rs.3000, Third prize Rs.2000 and two consolation prizes of Rs 1000. There is a separate prize for best speaker from rural area. This competition is encouraging and helpful for many students from rural area. Success of the practice and impact on the institution This competition is successful. Students who are real orators can stand up to the spontaneous round of the competition. Students from different areas, from various cities use to participate in it. Jalna, Pune, Nashik, Dhule, Jalgaon, Nanded, Parbhani, Latur are some districts from where students participate regularly. There are fifty percent girls who are the participants. Our college is an oldest college of Marathwada region, one of the parts of Maharashtra. It was established in Nizam state. College tries to maintain quality culture through different activities. This competition has added the glory of the college and helped to spread the name of the college.
